Continuing education credits (CEUs) are available for live and previously recorded courses from the American Academy of Audiology (AAA) and the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA). Additionally, many courses are offered for CE Credit from the AG Bell Academy for Listening and Spoken Language for the LSLs Certification. Please refer to information in the HOPE web area for individual course accreditation details. CEUs are administered for the HOPE Program by Audiology Online, which charges a \$99 annual fee for unlimited numbers of CEUs from AAA, ASHA, and AG Bell. Cochlear Americas offers a free Certificate of Participation for those who have completed live or archived courses and returned a Feedback Form via the designated mechanism.

HOPE is a Cochlear Americas program designed to support the cochlear implant and Baha community and the professionals who serve them. 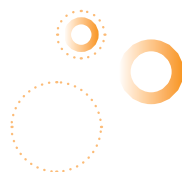
